

**ASSETs Course Descriptions- These classes are only offered during the second semester of the 2007-2008 school year (January 28<sup>th</sup> 2008-June 12<sup>th</sup> 2008)**

## **1. ACADEMIC STUDENT LEADERSHIP COURSE**

**Course Description:** This course is open to all students enrolled at Kennedy's campus. The purpose of the course is to give students extra help with homework and studying. All students enrolled in this course must attend everyday in order to gain the full benefits of the class. Each class will have its own Peer Tutors and Instructional Aides available for enrolled students. This is your opportunity to get free help with homework and studying. If you need more organization or structure to help you pass your classes, please sign up for the Academic Student Leadership Course. We can help!

## **2. PEER TUTORING CLASS**

**Course Description:** Students are trained as peer tutors in multi-subject areas. Students will learn what the duties and responsibilities of a peer tutor. Once the students are trained they will be assigned to classrooms from 3:30pm-4:30pm. Training time varies. Students are not required to stay at programming past 4:30pm, but have the option to stay and participate in enrichment activities or homework/study labs.

**Days/Times: M-F 3:30pm-4:30pm**

**Credit/Non-Credit:** This course can be taken for credit, but students must be available Monday through Friday from 3:30pm-4:30pm. If you are unable to attend on a daily basis, students may take this class for no credit and still earn community service time.

## **3. ROTC (Drill and Color Guard)**

**Course Description:** Drill is a valuable part of military training. It teaches mental and physical discipline. It also fosters teamwork, cooperation, and group spirit. Cadets, in mastering drill, develop pride, poise, and self-confidence, along with a sense of accomplishment. Students are encouraged to work on homework before or after their drill time. Homework/study labs will be available for student use.

## **8. People Reaching Out (PRO)**

**Course Description:** PRO After School is a youth mentoring program that builds positive relationships between high school students and elementary/middle school students through mentoring and prevention education. Students from Kennedy and their partner elementary /middle school are matched and meet one-on-one after school where they participate in recreation, enrichment and substance abuse and violence prevention lessons. High school mentors also complete extensive training in mentoring, activity planning & leadership, decision making, goal setting, life skills, health & nutrition and financial literacy. PRO After School provides training using youth development strategies which help teens build skills that equip them to take better advantage of opportunities in their futures.

## **9. Latino/Hispanic Leadership Class**

**Course Description:** This course is designed for Latino/Hispanic students but is open to all students enrolled at Kennedy. The course focus is Latino/Hispanic culture and history with an emphasis on life skills and college prep. Students will not only get help with homework and studying, but will have the opportunity to participate in many cultural enrichment activities.

## **10. Hmong Club/ELD Enrichment Class**

**Course Description:** This course offers students an opportunity to meet on a daily basis and receive help with homework, translations, and English language development. Teamwork and good sportsmanship will be expected by all members of the class/team. Some travel may be required due to competitions. This elective course is only offered to students enrolled in ASSETs.
