- Inclusiveness


What is youth-led program evaluation?

- A Youth Development Strategy


Why youth-led?

When youth lead an evaluation process, youth **frame** the issues.

- where and what to look at
- within a specific program
- within community context

Elements of High Quality

Organizational Capacity

- Sufficient time/resource/staff allocation
- Leadership support
- Follow through on youth recommendations/ institutional responsiveness
- "Adult development"
- Institutionalizing Cycle of Youth REP

Youth Identify New Areas

- New areas for program expansion
- Not served or underserved youth populations
