

3 STEPS TO PROVIDING FREE EYE EXAMS AND FREE GLASSES TO KIDS

WHO: Vision To Learn's mobile clinics will see all kids, ages 4 to 14

STEP 1: BEFORE WE GET THERE:

- All children need to have a vision screening prior to the arrival of the mobile clinic.
 The vision screening is a simple hand over eye, chart reading exercise that takes about 2 minutes per child.
- Vision To Learn can assist your organization with the screening and will provide the test.
- The kids who fail the visual screening should be given a Parental Consent Form and a Parent Information sheet to send home.
- Once your organization has received 20-25 signed Parental Consent Forms, it is time to schedule a mobile clinic visit. Please send all consent forms one week prior to our visit.



STEP 2: MOBILE CLINIC VISIT

• The mobile clinic will arrive with an optician and optometrist the morning of the visit. The clinic will need:

- **1.** A parking location that will easily allow for children to access the bus without crossing streets (usually on the playground or parking lot).
- **2.** We will also need an outlet for the clinic.
- **3.** Volunteer or Staff to escort the kids to the vehicle, as well as to translate, if needed.
- We can examine approximately 20-25 kids per day. If the number of signed consent forms is larger, subsequent visits to accommodate the remaining kids.
- Hours of Operation: The mobile clinic will examine children during the hours of your program.

STEP 3: CHILDREN RECEIVE GLASSES

- One week after the mobile clinic visits your program, the glasses will be ready for the kids.
- Depending on your program, Vision To Learn can either:
 - 1. Have an optician return to your program and fit the glasses on the child; or
 - 2. Mail the glasses to the child
