



3 STEPS TO PROVIDING FREE EYE EXAMS AND FREE GLASSES TO KIDS

WHO: Vision To Learn's mobile clinics will see all kids, ages 4 to 14

STEP 1: BEFORE WE GET THERE:

- All children need to have a vision screening prior to the arrival of the mobile clinic. The vision screening is a simple hand over eye, chart reading exercise that takes about 2 minutes per child.
- Vision To Learn can assist your organization with the screening and will provide the test.
- The kids who fail the visual screening should be given a Parental Consent Form and a Parent Information sheet to send home.
- Once your organization has received **20-25** signed Parental Consent Forms, it is time to schedule a mobile clinic visit. Please send all consent forms one week prior to our visit.



STEP 2: MOBILE CLINIC VISIT

- The mobile clinic will arrive with an optician and optometrist the morning of the visit. The clinic will need:
 1. A parking location that will easily allow for children to access the bus without crossing streets (usually on the playground or parking lot).
 2. We will also need an outlet for the clinic.
 3. Volunteer or Staff to escort the kids to the vehicle, as well as to translate, if needed.
- We can examine approximately 20-25 kids per day. If the number of signed consent forms is larger, subsequent visits to accommodate the remaining kids.
- Hours of Operation: The mobile clinic will examine children during the hours of your program.



STEP 3: CHILDREN RECEIVE GLASSES

- One week after the mobile clinic visits your program, the glasses will be ready for the kids.
- Depending on your program, Vision To Learn can either:
 1. Have an optician return to your program and fit the glasses on the child; or
 2. Mail the glasses to the child
